A Message from the Rabbi

Tu B'Shevat, the holiday that celebrates the sacredness of trees, offers us yet another window to contemplate the wellbeing of our planet and act lovingly and diligently as stewards of nature. Even the tiniest, overlooked gestures, or the simplest of tweaks to our ingrained daily routines, can make this world a better place.

One of the recommendations of the Reform Action Center of our movement, Reform Judaism, is to make home-cooked meals during the month of Shevat. The RAC's thinking behind this initiative is that cooking within the comfy confines of our own homes is "significantly cheaper, healthier, more energy efficient and produces less waste than eating out."

To illustrate their philosophy, the RAC suggests that we watch the following interview of acclaimed food journalist Mark Bittman: <u>https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=3vcKt5js0Vg</u>

In it, the veteran newspaper reporter and force behind the National best sellers "How to Cook Everything" and "How to Cook Everything Fast" explains why it is in our interest to make home-cooked meals.

He says, "80% of the supermarket food is barely definable as food. When you cook you shop for the other 20%. If you're buying the 20% of supermarket food that's real food you're encouraging real agriculture, you're taking control over what you eat, you're addressing the public health crisis (...) but as an individual the most effective thing you can do is cook for yourself."

On Saturday February 11, at 10:00 AM, we will be celebrating Tu B'Shevat together around the table in appreciation of the sustenance nature provides us as another Spring season approaches in Israel.

As our ancestors were farmers, our people have a long-standing culinary tradition. Our yearly holiday cycle is punctuated by special foods and dishes passed on from generation to generation. Furthermore it is always so rewarding to enjoy good food in good company at Temple Sinai. I really hope you can join us!

Nutritional Information

February is the month that we celebrate our sweeties so I think it's only fitting to talk about sweets. It's pretty common knowledge that added sugars should be limited in our diets but not many people really understand what foods contain added sugars. Added sugars include obvious ingredients like cane sugar and high fructose corn syrup, but they can also be disguised as rice syrup, crystal solids, or evaporated cane juice. These ingredients can be found in everything from cereals and breads to salad dressings and nut butters so it's really become a challenge to find products without some form of added sugar. This challenge becomes even more difficult once the conflicting messages about sugar types come into play. Many media outlets claim that coconut sugar, turbinado sugar, or organic sugars are better for you; but the science tells us that all added sugars (including honey, agave, maple syrup, and even many artificial sweeteners) all contribute to insulin resistance and other health issues without adding any nutritive value to food. In fact, the only sweetener proven to have no ill effects on insulin resistance is stevia. Unfortunately, stevia can have an unpleasant taste to some people. One of the easiest ways to cut down on your overall sugar consumption is to seek out and buy foods with no or limited added sugars. If you fill your pantry with low or no added sugar foods then you only have to pay attention to the sugars to add in yourself. Of course, if you pay attention to the sugars you add in you may find more cuts to be made. Coffee, tea, desserts, and even pasta sauces made at home are great areas to focus on when cutting back on self-added sugars. Just remember that wherever you decide to make changes, added sugars should be no more than 10% of your overall calorie intake.


