Nutritional Information

One of my favorite fun facts is that our bodies contain just as many bacteria cells as human cells. This past February, there was even a great article in an issue of Science News about how bacterial cells probably even outnumber human cells in the body. Most of these bacteria live in the GI tract and are crucial for immune function, digestion, and overall health. As an integral part of our bodies, it is important to care for them and create an environment in which they can thrive. Part of maintaining a healthy collection of gut bacteria is eating probiotics and prebiotics. Probiotics are strands of beneficial bacteria and come in abundance in fermented foods like yogurt, kimchi, kombucha, or sauerkraut. Probiotics can also be taken as a supplement and are especially important after taking antibiotics. Prebiotics are insoluble fibers like inulin that feed the beneficial bacteria and help keep harmful bacteria from multiplying. These fibers are easily found in grains, legumes, and vegetables. Of course, these foods are an important part of the diet anyway, but I think it's motivating to remember that eating them isn't just good for you but for the trillions of little helpers living inside of you too.

Caring Committee – Funeral/Shiva/Memorial Reception: If requested, the Caring Committee is available to assist regular temple members or their families with plans for a memorial reception held at Temple Sinai in honor of your loved one who was a regular member. If you and/or your family would like to plan your own memorial reception, the Caring Committee would be glad to offer guidance, if needed.

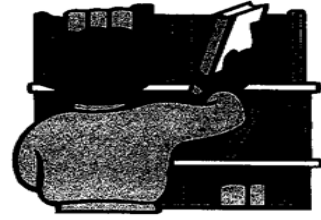

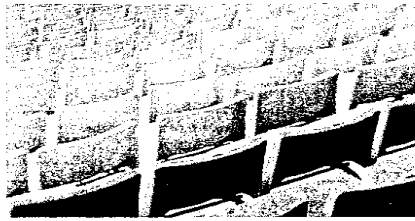
